Upon successful completion of the first year with average grades (2.5 GPA) or better, the second installment of \$1,000 will be mailed to the university/college to be applied to the second year of college.

Preference will be given to students planning to attend college/university in Alaska and those taking classes related to agriculture. Any changes to the requirements requested will be presented to and approved by the general membership of Northland Pioneer Grange No. 1.

- Applicant must be a <u>senior</u> at a high school in the Matanuska-Susitna Borough or in Chugiak, Alaska preparing to graduate in May or June of 2024, <u>and</u> must also be pursuing a degree in one or more of the following: <u>Agriculture</u>, <u>Forestry</u>, <u>Food/Home Economics</u>, <u>Natural Resources</u> <u>Management</u>, <u>Plant</u>, <u>Animal</u>, <u>and/or Soil Science</u>, <u>Veterinary Medicine or a</u> <u>degree that would advance Rural Community Development</u>.
